The Society for Accelerative Learning and Teaching (SALT) is a network of outstanding teachers and trainers who are masters of their areas of curriculum and who are committed to the transformation of the processes of education on our planet.

These master teachers comprise the SALT network which is dedicated to sharing positive, global, holistic, integrative, whole-brain, energizing and accelerative instruction techniques. In particular, SALT endorses and promotes the procedures of Suggestopedia developed by Georgi Lozanov and other related classroom practices which can produce marked increases in student learning.

The SALT network provides a communication link between instructional practitioners and supervisors by publishing a newsletter, a refereed research journal and resource manual. SALT annually produces an international forum of accelerative education ideas in the form of a conference of presenters who share gentle, state-of-the-art classroom technology.

SALT, as the American accelerative organization, maintains an affiliate relationship with accelerative methods organizations in other countries. Affiliates agree to share communications and conference attendance by one representative from each organization at member rates. Network organizations are currently active in Australia, Finland, France, Great Britain, Japan, Spain, Sweden, and West Germany.

The formation of state or regional conferences is encouraged in order to involve local persons who may be unable to attend the annual international gatherings.

Dr. Donald H. Schuster, ISU Professor of Psychology and a founder of SALT, is the long-standing Editor of the SALT Journal. Dr. Schuster completed one of the first government-funded evaluations of Lozanov's Suggestopedia in the United States public schools (Iowa Department of Public Instruction Grant: Final Report, 1978).
